



Pay School Fees Online

School fee information for the 2024-25 school year is now posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online. If you're unable to pay your school fees, you can apply to have certain fees waived. The application deadline is Dec. 16, 2024.

NOTE: Don't forget to also log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as field trips, class projects, extracurricular activities fees and more.




Counsellor's Corner...

Sticking with some brain research from last week, beside is a diagram of a **nerve cell** (neuron):

Neurons carry messages through electrochemical signals.

- 1. Cell Body (soma) which houses the neuron's control center (nucleus).
- 2. Dendrites are the part that receives messages from other cells.
- 3. Axons are transporters which relay signals from the dendrites.
- 4. Nerve endings which pass the message to the dendrites of another neuron.



Focusing on breathing can help our brains:

- -Calms the body by slowing heart rate, lowering blood pressure, and sharpening focus
- -Controlled breathing supports strong functioning in the higher brain
- -Lessens anxiety by overriding "fight, flight, freeze" from amygdala and gives control to frontal cortex
- -When breathing is deliberately regulated, the brain is set to think first and plan a response
- -Short, daily structured listening and breathing activities can create and strengthen nerve cell connections

All parents must go in and select their child's new teacher for this year. To pay for your order the website uses PayPal. There is an option to check out as a guest through PayPal if you do not have an account. Failure to pay for the order by the deadline will result in the order being cancelled.

If your child is sick on the day of their hot lunch, please call the office and let them know. No refunds will be given if a student is absent on the day of their hot lunch.

If you need to cancel or change an order, you must do so before the deadline. A refund will be processed as a credit on your account to be used for future hot lunch orders.

Once the deadline has passed orders cannot be changed or cancelled.

City of Fort Saskatchewan Launches Family Violence Prevention Month ${\sf Campaign}$

Theme: "The Elephant in the Room"

Fort Saskatchewan, AB, October 15, 2024 – This November, the City of Fort Saskatchewan, alongside the Fort Saskatchewan Family Violence Prevention Coalition, will lead a campaign to bring attention to the oftenoverlooked issue of family violence. The theme, "The Elephant in the Room," aims to break the silence surrounding family violence and empower the community with resources and support.

"Family violence is a subject many are reluctant to discuss," said Melissa Kondro, Community Development Coordinator for the City of Fort Saskatchewan. "Our goal is to bring it out of the shadows, create awareness, and encourage those affected to seek help."
