

What is the RAS?

- It is a network of long nerve pathways within the core of the brain stem
- It helps regular many basic body functions & connects the prefrontal cortex to the brain stem
- It sorts sensory information (visual, auditory, touch, smell, taste) that arrive from the spinal cord

• Relevant input are chosen by the RAS and sent to the prefrontal cortex Why does it matter?

- When dis-regulated the RAS will not correct filter information
- The RAS can be trained which helps with focus, regulation, and social cues
- Sensory awareness activities help in this training and regulation

The brain stem needs to be regulated first so correct communication occurs through the next levels of the brain.


TAKE YOUR KID TO WORK DAY



The theme, "The Elephant in the Room," aims to break the silence surrounding family violence and empower the community with resources and support.

"Family violence is a subject many are reluctant to discuss," said Melissa Kondro, Community Development Coordinator for the City of Fort Saskatchewan. "Our goal is to bring it out of the shadows, create awareness, and encourage those affected to seek help."
